JCOC Committee Attendance

Pending Chartering Student Organizations

- **Tech Corp**
  - Teaches underprivileged children how to use a computer, purchase/refurbish computers and donate them to children/schools
  - Software licensing is a possible issue
  - Active for about 1 year, have about 43 members
  - *RECCOMENDATION: GRANT CHARTER*
- **Students for Sensible Drug Policy**
  - Promote debate on drug issues, educate on drug enforcement
  - Send postcards to government to encourage debate
  - Part of a national organization, based in Washington, D.C.
  - About 20 active members, 72 on mailing list
  - Dues could be an issue when applying for a budget
  - *RECCOMENDATION: GRANT CHARTER*
- **Women's Gymnastics**
  - Started November, 2001
  - Compete in various gymnastics competitions in four events
  - 22 members, practice 3 days per week
  - *RECCOMENDATION: GRANT CHARTER*
- **Microsystems Packaging Research Center Student Organization**
  - Address student issues based on Georgia Tech's research center
  - Only Graduate students allowed to hold the office of President due to technical knowledge requirements
  - *RECCOMENDATION: GRANT CHARTER*
- **StORM**
  - Meteorology, EAS related group
  - Weather/EAS related activities, company tours, weather research
  - 15-20 Members
  - *RECCOMENDATION: GRANT CHARTER*
- **Taiwanese Student Association**
  - Active since Spring, 2002; 70 members
  - Helps familiarize Taiwanese students to American culture, provides a connection with Alumni and industry, promotes Taiwanese culture on campus.
  - *RECCOMENDATION: GRANT CHARTER*

### Student Organization Constitutional Revisions

- **Pride Alliance**
  - Changed Constitution to incorporate new JCOC policy, to confirm acceptance of GLBTQ issues
  - *RECCOMENDATION: APPROVE CONSTITUTION*
- **Phi Alpha Delta Pre-Law Fraternity**
  - Changed Constitution to incorporate new JCOC policy, clarify other issues
  - *RECCOMENDATION: APPROVE CONSTITUTION*

### Yellow Jacket Flying Club Discussion

- Jennifer Matthews talked to the club to help them make an informed decision and explain policy issues
- Felt that a good solution would be to separate the Yellow Jacket Flying Club (A Georgia Tech Student Organization) from the YJFC, Inc.
- Club wants to extend the deadline for resolution until the end of the semester
- SGA funds, if any, provided to the student organization would be to help defray costs to students
- Motion: Continue to suspend until October 31, 2002, at which time the revocation process will begin (PASSED 5-0-2)
  - This will allow the organization time to revise group structure

### Set Date for End of “SGA Pending” Status for Organizations

November 15, 2002: Orgs to submit all required paperwork if they submitted their Letter of Intent over 4 months ago. For organizations that submitted their LoI within the past 4 months, all paperwork is due 4 months after the submission of the LoI.

### Set Compliance Date for All Currently Chartered Student Organizations

January 31, 2003: All organizations must look at their constitution and compare it to the new JCOC policy. They must bring their constitutions into compliance by 1/31/2003. JCOC will review all organizations for compliance after this date, and will work to bring all organizations into compliance. Organizations are reminded that 2 weeks notice must be given to members before the organizations constitution is amended and voted on by the membership.
